Class description	<p>The wall hanging uses appliqué to quilt the project. You should be able to complete the wall hanging in one day. You can choose from any pattern on the wall in the classroom. We have some great winter patterns.</p> <p>In this class, you will learn raw edge and how to attach a binding. If you are an accomplished sewer, come and spend the day sewing with fellow stitchers. If you are relatively new to sewing and/or quilting, this is a good project to practice on.</p> <p>You must purchase the pattern to take the class. Fabric requirements are included in the pattern. I suggest that you cut two strips of fabric 2" wide for the binding first. (You will need four strips if you are using fat quarters). You may wish to cut your background and side pieces prior to class. If you are taking the class for the first time, please do not cut out any of the appliqué pieces.</p> <p>You do not need any special stitches on your machine to complete this wonderful project.</p> <p>NEW: You may also choose a new project from the book, <u>Quilter's Dozen Plus</u> by Janet Selck. These great patterns get snapped in on a background each month. You will use both appliqué and paper piecing. The book is available at the store, and you should look at the fabric requirements for the Snap-on Background, starting on page 6. I WOULD NOT RECOMMEND THIS PROJECT FOR A BEGINNER!</p>
Supply list	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sewing machine in good working condition and manual • Sewing machine feet: 1/4" and open toe • Beige thread for piecing • Embroidery Thread for appliqué (contrasting or matching) • Basic sewing supplies (thread, bobbin, scissors, needles, pins, etc.) • Paper-backed fusible web-Floriani Applikay is available at the store • Fine marking pen (we have IdentiPens at the store) • Hand sewing needle • Stiletto • Small, sharp scissors • Quilt basting spray or safety pins • Binding clips • Zip-loc bag for cut-up pieces • Spray starch • Small memo pad for notes • Rotary cutter, ruler, and mat (optional) • Additional supplies for paper piecing: size 14 needle, Paper piecing paper; wood iron, small mat and rotary cutter, add-a-quarter inch ruler, and a post card
